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# THE CAMEROON HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION SUMMARY INFORMATION ON VISITS TO DETENTION FACILITIES CONDUCTED IN 2021 AND 2022

# VISITS CONDUCTED IN 2021

The CHRC visited 21 prisons, 93 police custody units, two other detention facilities (Hôpital Jamot and the Meri DDR centre), in 2021. The information presented on the tables below was obtained during the prison visits.

# 8. Average cost for prisoner's food per month or per year

The average cost of feeding each prisoner per day is 408 CFA francs, the annual budget for this operation has increased by 45 per cent in five years, from 2,570,000,000 CFA francs in 2016 to 5,015,891,000 CFA francs in 2020.

## 9. Health situation in prisons

The budget for the care of prisoners, whether they have been convicted or remanded in custody, has not been increased since 2019. It was 1,015,000,000 CFA francs, for an average of 32,227 CFA francs per prisoner per year, in 2020.

The CHRC observed an acute lack of qualified medical staff assigned to the various detention facilities visited and of appropriate medication in the prisons of Poli, Guider and Tcholliré 1.

# 10. Common crimes that prisoners are accused of and possible sanctions under the law

Prisoners are generally arrested under proceedings for acts such as felonies or misdemeanours as defined by Law No. 2016/007 of 12 July 2016 relating to the Penal Code and are liable to the following penalties:

- a felony shall mean an offence punishable with death or with loss of liberty for a maximum of more than 10 years and fine where the law so provides
- a misdemeanour shall mean an offence punishable with loss of liberty or with fine, where the loss of liberty may be for more than 10 days but not for more than 10 years, and the fine more than 25,000 FCFA.

# 11. Recommendations of the NHRI of Cameroon for a constant improvement of the prisons conditions

#### To the Minister of Justice

- > generalise the use of prison labour for the production of food for prisoners
- > take measures to improve the quantity and quality of the daily food ration for prisoners
- build or equip infirmaries where needed, and to ensure that they are equipped with basic materials and medicines
- take all preventive measures to reduce the spread of contagious diseases such as scabies, in this case by providing prisoners with antiseptic soaps and respecting the rules of hygiene and sanitation discussed above
- improve conditions of detention through the construction of new prisons and the extension of existing ones, where possible, to enable especially the effective separation of different categories of prisoners
- > speed up court proceedings to reduce the number of prisoners and relieve prison congestion
- > ensure the effectiveness of alternative penalties provided for by the law
- > ensure that the provisions of the criminal procedure code for minors, whose detention is the exception, are effectively respected
- provide the public prosecutor's offices with vehicles to facilitate visits to check prisons
- > provide prisons with vehicles for the transport of prisoners and adapted sleeping equipment
- build or modernise and equip prison administrative blocks.

## To prison officials

- > extend to all prisons the computerised filing system concerning the legal status of prisoners
- > set up a system for reporting and punishing corrupt practices and the use of money for services within prisons
- > expand vaccination programmes against the most common diseases in prisons
- promote collaboration between the Ministry of Social Affairs (MINAS), child protection organisations and the prison administration to provide health and nutritional care for the newborns of mothers in prison
- promote the social reintegration of prisoners by extending training programmes in areas such as agriculture, livestock farming, carpentry, masonry, sewing, etc., in collaboration with the relevant authorities.

### To regional and local authorities

Further contribute to the improvement of the general conditions of prisons by implementing various projects within the prisons. This includes providing food and support for health, hygiene and sanitation (disinfection of prisons, emptying of septic tanks etc.), and programmes for water supply and the supply of generators for backup electricity.
